Notes on the Music

Missa ad Præsepe (1959)

George Malcolm (1919–1997)

A devout Roman Catholic, George Malcolm was Master of Music at Westminster Cathedral from 1947 to 1959. He had been trained as a concert pianist at the Royal College of Music after beginning study as the only child there at the age of seven and returning following his undergraduate studies at Oxford. But the war interrupted his fledgling career: he joined the RAF as a bandleader, organizing and conducting concerts all over England. During his time at the Cathedral after the war, Malcolm cultivated a full-throated 'Continental' style of singing in his choristers that contrasted with the more ethereal Anglican sound; it so captivated his friend Benjamin Britten that he wrote his Missa Brevis for the Westminster choir in 1959, just before Malcolm left his post there to pursue a full-time career as a harpsichordist. Malcolm wrote his Missa ad praesepe, 'Mass at the Crib,' in that same year. Its unaffected pastoral style evokes the long-standing tradition of shepherds' music for the Nativity which is perhaps most famously embodied in the instrumental 'Pifa' interlude of Handel's Messiah. Some hallmarks of this genre include drones reminiscent of bagpipes, simple tunes evoking peasant pipes or flutes, and gentle rocking rhythms.

Young Jesus Sweit

Robert Convery (b. 1954)

This lovely carol, often known as 'Balulalow', has been set by many composers including Peter Warlock, Benjamin Britten, and Sandy Denny. Its text is the 13th and 14th verses of Luther's famous Christmas Eve hymn Vom Himmel hoch (From heaven on high to earth I come), translated into Scots dialect by the ardently Protestant brothers Wedderburn and first published in the 1560s. Robert Convery, who studied composition at Westminster Choir College, The Curtis Institute, and The Juilliard School, wrote this setting in 1993 as a gift for the soprano Cynthia Richards-Hewes. He says: "The motet's folk-like tenderness is meant to conjure the same gentleness with which a rose unfolds to reveal its heart."
