



The Sacred Host will be placed upon your tongue or in the palm of your hand after which the Chalice is offered. Should you wish to receive by intinction, leave the host on your palm. The Chalicist will dip it in the consecrated wine and place it on your tongue. If you are not receiving the Sacrament, please cross your arms as the Priest approaches so that a blessing may be said. Should you be unable to manage steps, Holy Communion can be administered at your pew. The Ushers will be happy to assist you.


