world to come. Amen.




Let us pray: Commanded by saving precepts, and taught by divine institution, we are bold to say:



John 1, 1-14

✠ The Beginning of the holy Gospel according to John. Rx Glory be to thee, O Lord.

JN the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The same was in the beginning with God. All things were made by Him: and without Him was not anything made that was made. In Him was life, and the life was the light of men: and the light shineth in darkness, and the darkness comprehended it not. There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. The same came for a witness, to bear witness of the light, that all men through him might believe. He was not that light, but was sent to bear witness of that light.
