The Lesson from the Epistle of blessed Paul the Apostle to the Corinthians. I Cor. 4, 9–15

BRETHREN: I think that God hath set forth us the Apostles last, as it were appointed to death:
for we are made a spectacle unto the world, and to Angels, and to men. We are fools for Christ's
sake, but ye are wise in Christ: we are weak, but ye are strong: ye are honourable, but we are despised.
Even unto this present hour we both hunger and thirst and are naked, and are buffeted, and have no
certain dwelling-place, and labour, working with our own hands: being reviled, we bless: being
persecuted, we suffer it: being defamed, we intreat: we are made as the filth of the world, and are the
off-scouring of all things unto this day. I write not these things to shame you, but as my beloved sons I

warn you. For though ye have ten thousand instructors in Christ: yet have ye not many fathers. For in Christ Jesus I have begotten you through the Gospel. ℞ Thanks be to God.
