

The Lesson from the Epistle of blessed Paul the Apostle to the Corinthians. I Cor. 15, 51–57

RETHREN: Behold, I shew you a mystery: We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed. In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump: for the trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall be raised incorruptible: and we shall be changed. For this corruptible must put on incorruption: and this mortal must put on immortality. 




