Please stand when the bell rings to announce the entrance of the Ministers, then kneel when the ministers begin the prayers at the foot of the Altar.

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen. I will go unto the altar of God. R. Even unto the God of my joy and gladness.

W Give sentence with me, O God, and defend my cause against the ungodly people: O deliver me from the deceitful and wicked man.

R. For thou art the God of my strength, why hast thou put me from thee: and why go I so heavily, while the enemy oppresseth me?

O send out thy light and thy truth, that
they may lead me: and bring me unto thy holy
hill, and to thy dwelling.

R. And that I may go unto the altar of God, even unto the God of my joy and gladness: and upon the harp will I give thanks unto thee, O God, my God.

Then the Priest says Let us Pray, and ascending to the Altar, says secretly:

TAKE away from us we beseech thee, O Lord, our iniquities: that we may be worthy to enter with pure minds into the Holy of holies. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

WE pray thee, O Lord, through the merits of thy Saints, whose relics are here, and of all the Saints: that thou wouldest vouchsafe to pardon all my sins. Amen.

The Epistle Please be seated.

The Lesson from the Epistle of blessed Paul the Apostle to Titus.

Titus 3, 4–7

EARLY beloved: The kindness and love of God our Saviour toward man appeared: not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his mercy he saved us, by the

washing of regeneration, and renewing of the Holy Ghost, which he shed on us abundantly through Jesus Christ our Saviour: that being justified by his grace, we should be made heirs according to the hope of eternal life: in Christ Jesu our Lord. R. Thanks be to God.

The Gradual & Alleluia

Gradual. Ps. 118, 26, 27 & 23. Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord: God is the Lord who hath shewed us light. V. This is the Lord's doing: and it is marvellous in our eyes.

Alleluia, alleluia. V. Ps. 93, 1. The Lord is King, and hath put on glorious apparel: the Lord hath put on his apparel, and girded himself with strength. Alleluia.

Bowing before the middle of the Altar, the Priest says secretly:

CLEANSE my heart and my lips, almighty God, who didst cleanse the lips of Isaiah the prophet with a live coal: so of thy gracious mercy vouchsafe to cleanse me, that I may worthily proclaim thy holy Gospel. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Bid, Lord, a blessing. The Lord be in my heart and on my lips: that I may worthily and fitly proclaim his Gospel. Amen.

The Holy Gospel

Please stand for the Gospel.

V. The Lord be with you. R. And with thy spirit.

Luke 2, 15–20

▼ The Continuation of the Holy Gospel according to Luke. R. Glory be to thee, O Lord.

At that time: The shepherds said one to another: Let us now go even unto Bethlehem, and see this thing which is come to pass, which the Lord hath made known unto us. And they came with haste: and found Mary, and Joseph, and the babe lying in a manger. And when they had seen it, they made known abroad the saying which was told them concerning this child. And all they that heard it wondered: at those things which were told them by the shepherds. But Mary kept all these things, and pondered them in her heart. And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things that they had heard and seen, as it was told unto them. R Praise be to thee, O Christ.

The Priest kisses the Gospel, saying: By the words of the Gospel may our sins be wiped away.

Nicene Creed

Please kneel for the Creed.

BELIEVE in one God. The Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible. And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God. Begotten of his Father before all worlds, God of God, light of light, very God of very God. Begotten not made, being of one substance with the Father: by whom all things were made. Who for us men, and for our salvation came down from heaven. And was incarnate by the Holy Ghost of the Virgin Mary: And was made man. And was crucified also for us: under Pontius Pilate he suffered, and was buried. And the third day he

rose again according to the Scriptures. And ascended into heaven: and sitteth on the right hand of the Father. And he shall come again with glory to judge both the quick and the dead: Whose kingdom shall have no end. And I believe in the Holy Ghost, the Lord, and giver of life: who proceedeth from the Father and the Son. Who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified: who spake by the Prophets. And I believe one holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins. And I look for the resurrection of the dead. And the life of the world to come. Amen.

The Offertory

W. The Lord be with you. R. And with thy spirit. W. Let us pray.

Offertory. Ps. 93, 2–3. God hath made the round world so sure, that it cannot be moved: ever since the world began, hath thy seat, O God, been prepared, thou art from everlasting.

The Priest takes the Paten with the Host, saying secretly:

RECEIVE, O holy Father, almighty everlasting God, this spotless host, which I, thine unworthy servant, offer unto thee, my living and true God, for my numberless sins, offences, and negligences, and for all who stand here around, as also for all faithful Christians, both living and departed: that to me and to them it may avail for salvation unto life everlasting. Amen.

Then the Priest places the Host upon the Corporal. The Priest pours in wine and water in the Chalice, and blesses with the sign of the Cross the water to be mixed in the Chalice, saying:

GOD, who didst wondrously create, and yet more wondrously renew the dignity of human nature: grant that by the mystery of this water and wine we may be made co-heirs of his divinity, who vouchsafed to be made partaker of our humanity, even Jesus Christ thy Son our Lord: Who liveth and reigneth with thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, one God: world without end. Amen.

The Priest offers the Chalice, saying secretly:

WE offer unto thee, O Lord, the cup of salvation, humbly beseeching thy mercy: that in the sight of thy divine majesty it may ascend as a sweet-smelling savour for our salvation, and for that of the whole world. Amen.

The Priest places it upon the Corporal, and covers it with the Pall: then bowing slightly with hands joined upon the Altar, says secretly:

IN a humble spirit, and with a contrite heart, may we be accepted of thee, O Lord: and so let our sacrifice be offered in thy sight this day, that it may be pleasing unto thee, O Lord God.

OME, O thou Fount of holiness, almighty, eternal God: and bless this sacrifice, made ready for thy holy name.

WILL wash my hands in innocency, O Lord: and so will I go to thine altar: That I may shew the voice of thanksgiving, and tell of all thy wondrous works. Lord, I have loved the habitation of thy house and the place where thine honour dwelleth. O shut not up my soul with the sinners, nor my life with the blood-thirsty: In whose hands is wickedness: and their right hand is full of gifts. But as for me, I will walk innocently: O deliver me, and be merciful unto me. My foot standeth right: I will praise the Lord in the congregations. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be: world without end. Amen.

Then bowing slightly in the middle of the Altar, says secretly:

RECEIVE, O holy Trinity, this oblation which we offer unto thee in memory of the passion, resurrection, and ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ: and to the honour of blessed Mary ever Virgin, of blessed John Baptist, of the holy Apostles Peter and Paul, of these and of all the Saints: that it may avail for their honour, and for our salvation: and may they vouchsafe to intercede for us in heaven, whose memory we keep on earth. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

Then turning to the people, extending and joining hands, the Priest says, raising the voice:

PRAY, brethren: that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God the Father almighty. The Lord receive the sacrifice at thy hands, to the praise and glory of his name, both to our benefit, and that of all his holy Church.

The Secret Prayers

E beseech thee, O Lord, that these our gifts may be worthy of the mysteries of this day's Nativity, and may evermore shed forth thy peace upon us: that even as he who was born in our manhood did shew forth therein the Godhead, so we in these thy earthly creatures may be made partakers of that which is heavenly. Through the same.

ACCEPT, we beseech thee, O Lord, the gifts which we duly offer: that, by the merits and intercession of blessed Anastasia thy Martyr, they may be profitable to the advancement of our salvation. Through.

Preface of the Nativity

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 \forall \text{ Throughout all ages, world without end. R. Amen. \]
- W. The Lord be with you. R. And with thy spirit.
- W. Lift up your hearts. R. We lift them up unto the Lord.
- W. Let us give thanks unto our Lord God. R. It is meet and right so to do.

IT is very meet, right, and our bounden duty, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto thee, O Lord, Holy Father, Almighty, Everlasting God: Because through the mystery of the

Word made flesh, the light of thy glory hath shone anew upon the eyes of our mind: that as we acknowledge God made visible to man, we may through him be caught up to love of things invisible. And therefore with Angels and Archangels, with Thrones and Dominations, and with all the company of the heavenly host, we sing the majesty of thy glory, evermore praising thee, and saying:

HOLY, holy, holy, Lord God of Hosts. Heaven and earth are full of thy glory. Glory be to thee, O Lord most high. ♣ Blessed is he that cometh in the Name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Canon of the Mass

The Canon concludes: World without end. R. Amen.

LET us pray: Commanded by saving precepts, and taught by divine institution, we are bold to say:

UR Father, which art in heaven: hallowed be thy Name: Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, in earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread: And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us: And lead us not into temptation: but deliver us from evil.

The Priest says secretly: Amen, then taking the Paten and holding it upright upon the Altar:

ELIVER us, O Lord, we beseech thee, from all evils, past, present, and to come: and at the intercession of the blessed and glorious ever Virgin Mary, Mother of God, with thy blessed Apostles Peter and Paul, and with Andrew, and all the Saints, favourably grant peace in our days: that by the help of thine availing mercy we may ever both be free from sin and safe from all distress.

The Priest puts the Paten under the Host, uncovers the Chalice, genuflects, rises, takes the Host, and holding it with both hands over the Chalice, breaks it in the middle, saying:

Through the same Jesus Christ thy Son our Lord.

Then breaking a particle from the part in the left hand, saying:

Who liveth and reigneth with thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God.

Then in an audible voice:

Throughout all ages, world without end. R. Amen.

With the particle itself the Priest signs thrice over the Chalice, saying:

V. The peace of the Lord be alway with you. R. And with thy spirit.

Placing the particle into the Chalice, the Priest says secretly:

MAY this mingling and hallowing of the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ avail us who receive it unto everlasting life. Amen.

The Priest covers the Chalice, genuflects, rises, and bowing to the Sacrament, joins hands, and beating the breast thrice, says in an audible voice:

- O Lamb of God, that takest away the sins of the world: have mercy upon us.
- O Lamb of God, that takest away the sins of the world: have mercy upon us.
- O Lamb of God, that takest away the sins of the world: grant us thy peace.

Then bowing, with hands joined upon the Altar, the Priest says secretly:

LORD Jesu Christ, who saidst to thine Apostles, Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: regard not my sins, but the faith of thy Church: and vouchsafe to grant her peace and unity according to thy will: Who livest and reignest God, throughout all ages; world without end. Amen.

LORD Jesu Christ, Son of the living God, who by the will of the Father, and the cooperation of the Holy Ghost, hast through thy death given life unto the world: deliver me by this thy most sacred Body and Blood from all mine iniquities, and from every evil: and make me ever to cleave unto thy commandments, and suffer me never to be separated from thee: Who with the same God the Father and the Holy Ghost livest and reignest God, world without end. Amen.

Let the partaking of thy Body, O Lord Jesu Christ, which I, unworthy, presume to receive, turn not to my judgment and condemnation: but of thy goodness let it avail unto me for protection of soul and body, that I may receive thy healing: Who livest and reignest with God the Father in the unity of the Holy Ghost God, throughout all ages, world without end. Amen.

The Priest genuflects, rises, and says:

I will receive the bread of heaven, and call upon the name of the Lord.

Then bowing slightly, beating the breast three times, the Priest says thrice:

LORD, I am not worthy, *And he proceeds secretly:* that thou shouldest come under my roof: but speak the word only, and my soul shall be healed.

The Body of our Lord Jesus Christ preserve my soul unto everlasting life. Amen.

Then the Priest takes the Host. Uncovering the Chalice, genuflecting, collecting the fragments, and cleansing the Paten over the Chalice, the Priest says secretly:

WHAT reward shall I give unto the Lord for all the benefits that he hath done unto me? I will receive the cup of salvation, and call upon the name of the Lord. I will call upon the Lord which is worthy to be praised, so shall I be safe from mine enemies.

The Priest takes the Chalice in the right hand and signing with it says: The Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ preserve my soul unto everlasting life. Amen. Then the Priest receives the Blood with the particle. Then taking one particle, holding it raised above the Paten, and turning to the people, the Priest says in a clear voice:

We Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who taketh away the sins of the world. We Lord, I am not worthy, that thou shouldest come under my roof: but speak the word only, and my soul shall be healed. *iij*

The Priest administers the Sacrament saying to each person:

The Body of our Lord Jesus Christ preserve thy soul unto everlasting life. Amen.

The Priest returns to the Altar and says secretly:

RANT, O Lord, that what we have taken with our mouths we may receive in purity of heart: and let this temporal gift avail for our healing unto life eternal.

The Priest presents the Chalice to the minister, who pours into it a little wine, then continues:

Let thy Body, O Lord, which I have taken, and thy Blood which I have drunk, cleave unto my members: and grant; that no stain of sin may remain in me, whom thou hast refreshed with these pure and holy sacraments: Who livest and reignest world without end. Amen.

The Communion Verse

The Priest washes and wipes the fingers, takes the ablution, wipes the mouth and the Chalice, and then covers and places on the Altar as before, then proceeds:

Communion. Zech. 9, 9. Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Sion, shout, O daughter of Jerusalem: behold, thy King cometh, the holy one and the Saviour of the world.

The Postcommunion Collects

V. The Lord be with you. R. And with thy spirit.

Let us pray.

ORD, who by the wondrous Nativity of thy Son hast put off from us the old nature of our manhood: grant that by this Sacrament of his new Birth we may ever be inwardly restored in our souls. Through the same. R. Amen.

Let us pray.

CORD, who hast satisfied this thy family with sacred gifts: we beseech thee, that we may at all times be comforted by the intercession of her whose festival we celebrate. Through. R. Amen.

The Dismissal

- W The Lord be with you. R. And with thy spirit.
- V. Ite, Missa est. R. Deo grátias.

The Priest bows before the midst of the Altar, and with hands joined thereon, says secretly:

Let this my bounden duty and service be pleasing to thee, O holy Trinity: and grant; that the sacrifice, which I, unworthy, have offered before the eyes of thy majesty, may be acceptable to thee, and may through thy mercy obtain thy gracious favour for me and for all for whom I have offered it. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Blessing

THE Peace of God, which passeth all understanding, keep your hearts and minds in the knowledge and love of God, and of his Son Jesus Christ our Lord: And the Blessing of God Almighty, the Father, ** the Son, and the Holy Ghost, be amongst you, and remain with you alway. R. Amen.

The Last Gospel

Please stand for the Last Gospel.

W The Lord be with you. R And with thy spirit.

John 1, 1–14

▼ The Beginning of the holy Gospel according to John.

R. Glory be to thee, O Lord.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The same was in the beginning with God. All things were made by Him: and without Him was not anything made that was made. In Him was life, and the life was the light of men: and the light shineth in darkness, and the darkness comprehended it not. There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. The same came for a witness, to bear witness of the light, that all men through him might believe. He was not that light, but was sent to bear witness of that light. That was the true light, which lighteth every man that cometh into the world. He was in the world, and the world was made by him, and the world knew him not. He came unto his own, and his own received him not. But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name: which were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God.
