

AT THE REQUIEM MASS

Organ

Please stand when the bell rings to announce the entrance of the Ministers. The Choir then begins to sing the Introit & Kyrie, then all kneel when the ministers begin the Preparation, and recites in a low voice:

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen. I will go unto the altar of God. R. Even unto the God of my joy and gladness.

R: God Almighty have mercy upon thee, forgive thee thy sins, and bring thee to everlasting life.


Please be seated while the Sacred Ministers prepare and incense the Altar. After the incensing, the Priest kisses the Altar, and turning to the people, says, raising his voice a little:

PRAY, brethren: that this my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God the Father almighty. RX May the Lord receive the sacrifice at thy hands, to the praise and glory of his name, both to our benefit, and that of all his holy Church.

The Priest in a low voice says: Amen, and adds the Secret Prayer:

WE beseech thee, O Lord, to have mercy upon the soul of thy servant Ben, for which we offer unto thee this sacrifice of praise, humbly entreating thy majesty: that, through this our bounden duty and service, it may be worthy to attain unto everlasting rest. Through.

Preface of the Dead

It is very meet, right, and our bounded duty, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto thee, O Lord, Holy Father, Almighty, Everlasting God: through Christ our Lord. In whom hath shone forth unto us the hope of a blessed resurrection: that they who bewail the certain condition of their mortality may be consoled by thy promise of immortality to come. For the life of thy faithful people, O Lord, is changed, not taken away: and at the dissolution of the tabernacle of this earthly sojourning, a dwelling place eternal is made ready in the heavens. And therefore with Angels and Archangels, with Thrones and Dominations and with all the company of the heavenly host, we sing the majesty of thy glory, evermore praising thee and saying:

Please kneel when the Ministers kneel. While the Choir sings the Sanctus, the Priest recites the Canon of the Mass on the following page in a low voice.

THE CANON OF THE MASS

OST merciful Father, we humbly pray thee through Jesus Christ thy Son our Lord, and we ask that thou accept and bless these gifts, these presents, these holy and unspoiled sacrifices. We offer them unto thee, first, for thy holy catholic Church: that thou vouchsafe to keep it in peace, to guard, unite, and govern it throughout the whole world: together with thy servant *N*. our Pontiff and *N*. our Bishop and all the faithful guardians of the catholic and apostolic faith.

Commemoration for the Living

REMEMBER, O Lord, thy servants and handmaids N. and N. and all who here around us stand, whose faith is known unto thee and their steadfastness manifest, on whose behalf we offer unto thee: or who themselves offer unto thee this sacrifice of praise, for themselves, and for all who are theirs; for the redemption of their souls, for the hope of their salvation and safety: and who offer their prayers unto thee, the eternal God, the living and the true.

NITED in one communion, we venerate the memory, first, of the glorious ever Virgin Mary, Mother of our God and Lord Jesus Christ: as also of thy blessed Apostles and Martyrs, Peter and Paul, Andrew, James, John, Thomas, James, Philip, Bartholomew, Matthew, Simon and Thaddeus: Linus, Cletus, Clement, Xystus, Cornelius, Cyprian, Lawrence, Chrysogonus, John and Paul, Cosmas and Damian: and of all thy Saints; grant that by their merits and prayers we may in all things be defended with the help of thy protection. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

Here the Minister rings the warning bell, and the Celebrant continues:

WE beseech thee then, O Lord, graciously to accept this oblation from us thy servants, and from thy whole family: order our days in thy peace, and bid us to be delivered from eternal damnation, and to be numbered in the fold of thine elect. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

VOUCHSAFE, O God, we beseech thee, in all things to make this oblation blessed, approved and accepted, a perfect and worthy offering: that it may become for us the Body and Blood of thy dearly beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ.

WHO the day before he suffered, took bread into his holy and venerable hands, and with eyes lifted up to heaven unto thee, God, his almighty Father, giving thanks to thee, He blessed, brake and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, and eat ye all of this.

For this is my Body.

Likewise after supper, taking also this goodly chalice into His holy and venerable hands, again giving thanks to Thee, He blessed, and gave it to His disciples, saying: Take and drink ye all of it.

For this is the Chalice of my Blood, of the new and eternal testament: the mystery of faith: which shall be shed for you and for many for the remission of sins.

As oft as ye shall do these things, ye shall do them in remembrance of me.

HEREFORE, O Lord, we thy servants, and thy holy people also, remembering the blessed passion of the same Christ thy Son our Lord, as also his resurrection from the dead, and his glorious ascension into heaven: do offer unto thine excellent majesty of thine own gifts and bounty, the pure victim, the holy victim, the immaculate victim, the holy Bread of eternal life, and the Chalice of everlasting salvation.

VOUCHSAFE to look upon them with a merciful and pleasant countenance: and to accept them, even as thou didst vouchsafe to accept the gifts of thy servant Abel the Righteous, and the sacrifice of our Patriarch Abraham: and the holy sacrifice, the immaculate victim, which thy high priest Melchisedech offered unto thee.



Through Christ our Lord.

THROUGH whom, O Lord, thou dost ever create all these good things, dost sanctify, quicken, bless, and bestow them upon us. Through him, and with him, and in him, O God the Father almighty, in the unity of the Holy Ghost, all honour and glory are thine.

The Priest genuflects, rises, takes the Host, and holding it with both hands over the Chalice, breaks it in the middle, saying: Through the same Jesus Christ thy Son our Lord. Then from the left half breaking a particle, saying: Who liveth and reigneth with thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God:

John 1, 1–14


